

To examine and discuss the meaning of the lyrics of the song 'Gee Seven'

To learn history, geography and maths facts relating to the G7 song lyrics

TEACHER INPUT

Go through the PowerPoint with the pupils, stopping and discussing as needed. Play the song as needed.



PUPIL ACTIVITIES

Teacher-led discussion to support learning and understanding of the lyrics of the song.

Extension activities highlighted on the PowerPoint as needed, for example:

Who was Pythagoras?

What are the seven continents? Can you find them on a map?

What are the names of the seven hills of Rome?

See how far you get squaring a number and then cubing it.

Other activities at teacher's discretion.


PLENARY


